

Home Learning

We have had another week of some outstanding home learning being produced. Thank you to everyone for their incredible efforts with this topic.



After half term in Otters-

After half term Otters will be focusing on a new class book, this will link to our new Topic. We will be reading Cops & Robbers by Janet & Alan Ahlberg. We will learn parts of the text and think of some actions to help us. We will discuss what we like about the text and consider the rhyming parts.


Our new topic will be 'People who help us'. We will think about all of the people in the community who help us when we are in need. We will think about what we might have to do if we wanted to have one of these jobs when we grow up. We hope to meet some real 'People who help us' too!

Reception will be counting up to 10 objects which cannot be moved. They will be matching numerals to the number in a set. They will understand that zero describes an empty set. They will be counting backwards from 10 to 1 (using songs/rhymes) and they will continue a repeating pattern with two colours/shapes/objects.

Year 1 will be counting to 100 in ones and tens from zero. They will count on and back starting from any number up to 20. They will order numbers to 20 on a track, then a beaded line. The children will mark on numbers just before and after 5, 10, 15, and 20. They will compare two numbers less than 20 and say which is more or less.

After half term in Orcas-

We will be reading 'The Lion and the Unicorn' by Shirley Hughes, exploring the issues raised in it through drama, and writing messages to evacuees to link in with the launch of our new topic.



We will continue to practise subtraction using number lines and visual maths (year 2), moving onto formal column subtraction (year 3 and 4) with larger numbers. We will solve word problems involving both addition and subtraction.

Our new topic will be 'The Home Front'. We will place the Second World War on our timeline and explore what we already know about WWII. We will watch videos of evacuees being interviewed to find out how life changed during the Second World War.



<u>After half term in</u> <u>Dolphins-</u>

We have worked hard in Dolphins this term and will work even harder after half term.

During our English lessons, we will be using our WW2 Topic to focus our writing, starting by looking at Diary Entries and how we can include all the necessary writing skills expected of Dolphins.

In Maths, we will be looking at Multiplication and Division, how they are linked, mental strategies and also how to spot patterns and solve problems efficiently and effectively.

Our Topic will be based around WW2 and 'The Home Front' so any prior learning and reading around this topic would be fantastic.

Remember, to read for around 30 minutes every day, write as you wish and to recap Place Value, Subtraction and Addition while out and about this half term.
